Many members often ask if Burnaby Minor Hockey Association has a donation equipment program, unfortunately we just don't have the space to store the gear (as those of you who have ever picked up jerseys can see firsthand). In addition, Canlan Scotiabank kindly provides us space to gather the equipment.



If you have used hockey equipment taking up space in your garage or basement, this is a great opportunity to free up some space, donate the equipment (including other types of sporting equipment – yes, we'll even take bikes!) and make a great contribution to the community. We filled the backs of moving trucks with hockey equipment, tennis racquets, soccer gear, baseball bats/gloves/helmets, ski equipment and bikes!

BMHA families are encouraged to donate and drop off their sporting goods:

- All types of sporting equipment will be accepted (except for skis older than 10 years)

Kidsport will then offer the equipment at the Used Sporting Goods Sale, this year they will have a Hockey-specific sale:


- Saturday, August 14th - 10am to 3pm

HOCKEY CANADA U11 PATHWAY - What Is This & What Does It Mean?

For the last few years, Hockey Canada has been developing the U11 Pathway program - a progressive, learn to play teaching curriculum that is age-appropriate and skill-specific for 9-10 year-olds. It is a continuous opportunity for young players to develop and refine fundamental movement skills (skating, turning, acceleration), manipulation skills (shooting, puck control, passing) and overall motor skills (balance, coordination, agility) in a fun and safe environment, promoting skill development through self-confidence.



The program was scheduled to be implemented last season, but Covid restrictions didn't allow for the full rollout of the U11 Pathway and much was postponed until this season.

Some of the key changes identified by Hockey Canada include:

- No formal tryouts/evaluations during the first week of school where school starts the week after Labour Day (will be implemented for BMHA 2021-22 season)
- minimum of 4 practices/skill sessions offered prior to formal evaluations starting (already BMHA process)
- tryouts must be a minimum of three sessions (already BMHA process)
- must have a period of development time following team selection and prior to start of regular season (already BMHA process)
- must be tournament style playoffs vs. elimination rounds (will be implemented for 2021-22 PCAHA season)

PRE-SEASON CAMPS - Save the Dates!

Burnaby Minor will again be offering its popular pre-season camps!

Rust Removal Camps: August 30 – September 3 (U11, U13, U15/18) – a great way for Bulldog & Wildcat players to get their “skating legs” back before the start of the season. Camps will be division-specific and targeted towards “C” division players.

High Performance Camps: August 23 - 27 (U11, U13, U15, U18) – with drills and tempo at an elevated level, these division-specific camps are designed for Bulldogs & Wildcats with excellent skating, stickhandling, passing and shooting skills. They are targeted for players at Rep level but open to all who possess the required skills to execute drills that are more complex.

Goalie Camp: August 23 – 27 – for all skill levels from U11 and older.

All Rust Removal, Goalie and High Performance camp details will be published on the [Camps/Clinics](#) page of the website and available for registration starting 9am August 3rd. Limited spots are available, so register early!



“C”/ HOUSE ICE SESSIONS - Start Tuesday, Sept. 7th

“C”/ House ice times will start up Tuesday, September 7th! Groups and ice times should be emailed and posted to your TeamSnap schedule prior to September 3rd. For those in U11 and U13 divisions, early morning ice times come into effect starting Saturday, September 11th.



For the first two weeks (Sept. 7 to Sept. 19), players will be placed into groups and assigned ice times - these ice times are not “set for the season”. The third week will look closer to “regular season” ice times for the teams within your division.

REP TRYOUT PROCESS

To help answer questions regarding tryouts for this season, including registration, general procedures, attendance, evaluation criteria and the evaluation process, please read the [Rep Tryout Process](#). There have been various changes from previous years, so please take the time to carefully review this year’s information. Also, a reminder that the [Rep “A” Hockey - Player/Family Commitment & Expectation Agreement](#) will need to be signed and handed in by tryout participants at their first ice time when signing in at the registration desk.

TENTATIVE SCHEDULE

The first round of Rep Tryouts is scheduled to start Saturday, August 28, 2021 for the U13, U15 and U18 divisions. As per the U11 Pathway, U11 tryout participants will hit the ice for pre-evaluation ice sessions beginning Monday, August 30 and evaluated ice sessions will begin no earlier than Saturday, September 11. A tentative schedule will be made available after August 10 and posted on the website. There are no ice times scheduled for the Labour Day long weekend.

Give Back & Earn Valuable Volunteer Hours!



REFEREES SUMMER UPDATE - Message from RIC Dennis Sato

Hello everyone! I can't believe how long it's been since most of us have been on the ice and officiated a game. The time is coming!... Here are some important bits of information that everyone should know.

1. If you are interested in becoming a new official this season, the registration and training will be delayed this season. There is much to do to catch up with last year's group first. Look for more information in October!
2. All returning officials (if you were certified for 2020-2021) have valid certification only until the end of this year.
3. If you wish to continue officiating into 2022, you **MUST** take a recertification clinic. Clinics for returning officials will be online. Traditionally, there will be multiple dates and times, but I highly recommend signing up for a class as soon as you can. Registration is not open yet so check back frequently. You can check here for information <https://www.bchockey.net/Content.aspx?id=295>.
4. If you are a returning official, BC Hockey has adapted a discount offer for this season only. All returning officials will receive a \$74 discount at time of registration. If you are not a registered player, don't forget to pay for the additional insurance.
5. Anyone who will be 18 years old by Dec 31, 2021 must have a Criminal Record Check done. You'll find information here: <https://www.bchockey.net/Content.aspx?id=301>
