PICTURE DAY(S) IS COMING - Set for December 4 & 5

With the generous support of the **International Union of Operating Engineers (IUOE) Local 115**, our pictures will be taken at:

This season's team and individual pictures will be taken over two days:

- Day 1 - December 4 (Saturday), 10:00 am - 4:00 pm
- Day 2 - December 5 (Sunday), 10:00 am - 2:00 pm



In the next week, your Team Manager will be assigned a time slot for their team and individual player pictures. Your Team Manager will let you know your time slot and will also be handing out picture order envelopes to every player. **It is VERY important that parents complete the picture information form BEFORE picture day and give them to your Team Manager.** Because of COVID restrictions, there will not be much opportunity to fill out forms at picture time.

Full details about our Picture Days will be passed along to Team Managers. A few items to note are:

- Pictures will be taken without skates. Players are NOT to bring their skates or helmets to the picture session.
- All players are to come to the photo session fully dressed in their equipment, with gloves and sticks. There are no changing facilities at the photo shoot venue. Check with your Team Manager about how they want players to dress.
- Players will be required to wear their COVID face masks inside the facility and only remove them for their photo session.
- No parents will be permitted inside the building lobby or auditorium. Team Coaches and Managers will organize their teams prior to the photo shoot.
- Free parking is available on the north side of the building. Team Coaches and Managers will escort their team into the auditorium for their picture shoot and then out the west doors of the auditorium to meet up with parents in the parking area.

As this is a new way for us to do team pictures, we are requesting your patience and understanding if things don't go as smoothly as we plan. Thank you!

December 1 Deadline

A reminder for all Team Officials to complete their required certifications. CATT should be completed ASAP, and the deadline for all other certifications is December 1. After that point in time, all unqualified officials will be derostered from the team. A summary of qualifications as outlined by PCAHA is as follows:

Note 1: BC Hockey requires that each team designate a Head Coach.

Note 2: Each team must have at least one qualified Team Safety Person registered. Failure to have a qualified Team Safety Person registered with the team on or before **December 1st** will result in the team being ineligible for playoffs. Where there are no playoffs (U9 and below), fines or other disciplinary action will result.

Note 3: All team officials must submit a current Criminal Record Check (CRC) and Vulnerable Sector (VS) check prior to participation.

Note 4: Development 1 Coaches must complete maintenance modules (professional development) to retain certification.

Note 5: Coaches who acquired Coach 2 - Coach Level in 2016-2017 or prior are also qualified at Coach 1 - Intro to Coach Level.

Note 6: Beginning in 2020-2021 the Coach 2 - Coach Level clinic includes the Checking Qualification module.

Note 7: On-ice helpers rostered in HCR are not Team Officials and may not participate in games in any capacity.

Clinic Fee Reimbursements

- **HCSP & RIS Reimbursements** - For Hockey Canada Safety Program (HCSP) and Respect In Sport (RIS) clinic costs, please email admin@burnabyminor.com with your name, team that you were rostered to, and a copy of your receipt and completion certificate, along with the address to which to mail your cheque all contained within one email.
 - **Coaching Clinic Reimbursements** - Coaching clinic attendees are required to complete post-task assignments that must be first verified by the Head Coach of BMHA. In-person Coach Assignment Check & Signoff sessions will be held in late January/early February for verification. Once verified, you can then submit the post-task assignments to BC Hockey for formal certification. Once you have been certified, you can then submit a reimbursement request for your coaching clinic fees to headcoach@burnabyminor.com with a copy of your receipt.
