Parent Meeting Requirements

BC Hockey requires that all Minor Hockey Associations, host a Parent Meeting prior to November 15 annually and must contain...

- Review of key MHA Policies and Procedures i.e., Locker Room, Team Selection, Ice Times
- Review of the Association complaint process / policy
- Code of Conduct expectations
- Sportsmanship Starts in the Stands (next slide)

Failure to comply with this requirement will result in the cancellation of BC Hockey sanctioning for events hosted or operated by the Minor Hockey Association.

NOTE: Unsanctioned events are not eligible for coverage under the Hockey Canada Insurance

Upon completion of the team meeting, the team manager will send the meeting agenda and summary to their division manager.

The summary will include the following information:

- 1) Team hosting the team meeting
- 2) Name of team manager & head coach
- 3) Date of the parent meeting
- 4) Number of parents attended
- 5) Confirm that the Sportsmanship in the Stands content was presented (please watch the short video)

The division managers will collect the team manager's summaries and submit a division report via the following google forms. https://forms.gle/vC44pdmVYtfezDTX6

DMs to upload one team meeting agenda, we do not need all of the team's agendas.

Once all BMHA divisions have submitted their reports, BMHA risk manager will submit an association report to BC Hockey to confirm we have completed the requirement.







Risk Management

Team Officials

- Criminal Record Check must be completed, you cannot work with the kids or be rostered until it is.
- Be present
- Rule of Two
- Ensure certifications are as required Check your Hockey Canada Profile
- Wear proper gear on ice
- Ensure only rostered officials are on the ice / bench
- HCSP volunteer meeting

Note 1: BC Hockey requires that each team designate a Head Coach.

Note 2: Each team must have at least one qualified Team Safety Person registered. Failure to have a qualified Team Safety Person registered with the team on or before **December 1st** will result in the team being ineligible for playoffs. Where there are no playoffs (U7 and U9), fines or other disciplinary action will result.

Note 3: All team officials must submit a current Criminal Record Check (CRC) and Vulnerable Sector (VS) check prior to participation.

Note 4: Development 1 Coaches must complete maintenance modules (professional development) to retain certification.

Note 5: Coaches who acquired Coach 2 - Coach Level in 2016-2017 or prior are also qualified at Coach 1 - Intro to Coach Level.

Note 6: On-ice helpers/volunteers rostered in HCR are not Team Officials and may not participate in games in any capacity.

Risk Management

Travel / Team Event Insurance

- BC Hockey / PCAHA rules
- When in doubt, ask!

Tournaments

- President / PCAHA / BC Hockey approval required
- Forms available on PCAHA website
- Require official HCR from Registrar







Hockey Canada Insurance

- Please be aware that if a team intends to book ice that is not provided by BMHA using team funds, they must obtain special event sanction from Hockey Canada before using the ice. Failure to do so will result in the event not being covered by Hockey Canada's insurance and will be in contravention of BMHA's policies. If a team wishes to regularly rent ice that is not provided by BMHA using team funds, they must arrange for ice rental through BMHA to ensure insurance coverage.
- If engaging a private service provider, they must be formally registered through BC Hockey
 as either a team official or "Associate Member". This ensures that the individual has the
 basic requirements (like CRC, RIS, etc.). BC Hockey advised that utilizing a non-approved
 private service provider will nullify insurance coverage.

- Parent → Team Manager → Coach → DM → Director → VP Programs
- 24-Hour Rule

Discipline

- BMHA Policy 20.101
- Coach can suspend player for up to 2 games (U11 and up)
- Suspensions more than 2 games must be approved by Executive

Message from our Referee In Chief

As Referee in Chief, I would like send all Team Officials and parents a friendly reminder to treat game officials with the utmost respect.

Referees are an integral part of the game. As the saying goes... "No referees, no games."

Young, minor hockey referees need support and encouragement from everyone.

Abusive behaviour towards any official will not be tolerated.

The majority of minor hockey officials are young and inexperienced.

They are eager to learn and eager to develop and need to be looked at no differently than any player.

Whenever a game is finished, players usually hear "good job", "good game", "nice game"... despite whatever the outcome of the game was.

Officials should hear the same encouraging comments.

Excited, nervous and unsure but proud and brave, they muster enough courage to put on that striped jersey and they put themselves out there. They are exposed to both teams, players, coaches, and parents. You do not realize how intimidating it can be unless you put yourself in their position.

So do me a favour, be on their side for a while.

Ice Protocols

- Return unusable practice or game ice ASAP to ice@burnabyminor.com so ice can be reassigned
- A minimum of 3 weeks notice of the date of the returned ice is required, eg. Halloween -
- the window is closed to return Oct 31 ice as of Oct 18, 2023 meeting
- Game Conflicts
- Note the ice belongs to BMHA and not the team. There may be an occasion where an ice
- time will be taken to resolve a conflict game
- Free Ice Available posting
- Ice requests from Free Ice posting will always be confirmed
- Team Manager to add/change events/games in TeamSnap
- We DO NOT want ice sitting empty at any time
- Teams with No Shows will have their ice deposit cheque cashed

Hockey Canada Registration Number & Affiliate Player Requests

Also known as: HCR#, Hockey Canada Identification Number or HCID

You need to include the player's HCID in any player inquiries.

When requesting an AP

- -please submit full request including game numbers and HCIDs to president@burnabyminor.com (ideally as a word doc)
- -requires explanation if not calling up from younger age group
- -Goalie AP, even though no limit any longer, you must rotate
